

While many of us think of John the Baptist when it comes to baptism, some theologians believe the act of baptism began with the Jewish high priests. The origins of baptism might be found in the book of Leviticus where the Levitical priests were commanded to perform a symbolic cleansing in water before and after performing their priestly duties.

Leviticus 16:4 tells us, *“He is to put on the sacred linen tunic, with linen undergarments next to his body; he is to tie the linen sash around him and put on the linen turban. These are sacred garments; so he must bathe himself with water before he puts them on.”*

Scripture also states in Leviticus 16:23-24, *“Then Aaron is to go into the Tent of Meeting and take off the linen garments he put on before he entered the Most Holy Place, and he is to leave them there. He shall bathe himself with water in a holy place and put on his regular garments. Then he shall come out and sacrifice the burnt offering for himself and the burnt offering for the people, to make atonement for himself and for the people.”*

Although the act described in these Old Testament passages was not specifically called “baptism,” it does highlight how important and holy ceremonial cleansing is to God.

### Into the Bible

Then Peter said, “Surely no one can stand in the way of their being baptized with water. They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have.” So he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked Peter to stay with them for a few days.”* [Acts10:44-47]
